

How to Get To The Functionsuite Office and Studio:

By Car

When travelling from the North, over the Forth Road Bridge, take the road ahead towards South Gyle, and follow the signs for the city bypass (A720). Once on the bypass, continue round until you see an exit marked Lothianburn Junction. Leave the bypass at this point and turn first left at the roundabout towards the city centre. Continue for approximately 2 miles through a series of traffic lights until you pass through a junction with a Bank of Scotland on the left hand corner and a large free-standing clock on your right hand side. Continue ahead at this junction until you see a left turn signposted 'Royal Edinburgh Hospital' and 'Scottish Ambulance Service'. Once in the hospital grounds follow signs to the Andrew Duncan Clinic.

When travelling from the West (M8), continue to the end of the motorway till you come to a large roundabout. At the roundabout, take the third exit signposted city bypass (A720). Continue until you reach the exit signposted Lothianburn Junction. Leave the bypass at this point and turn first left at the roundabout towards the city centre. Continue for approximately 2 miles through a series of traffic lights until you pass through a junction with a Bank of Scotland on the left hand corner and a large free-standing clock on your right hand side. Continue ahead at this junction until you see a left turn signposted 'Royal Edinburgh Hospital' and 'Scottish Ambulance Service'. Once in the hospital grounds follow signs to the Andrew Duncan Clinic.

When travelling from the South (A1), before you reach Edinburgh you will see a junction signposted city bypass (A720). Take this exit and follow the A720 northbound. At the first roundabout, continue straight over and continue on the A720 until you reach the exit signposted Lothianburn Junction. Leave at this exit and turn right at the first roundabout towards town, and straight over at the second. Continue for approximately 2 miles through a series of traffic lights until you pass through a junction with a Bank of Scotland on the left hand corner and a large free-standing clock on your right hand side. Continue ahead at this junction until you see a left turn signposted Royal Edinburgh Hospital and Scottish Ambulance Service. Once in the hospital grounds follow signs to the Andrew Duncan Clinic.

By Bus

The 15, 16, 17 and 23 bus services all pass nearby the Royal Edinburgh Hospital. See [Lothian Buses](#) for further information. Get off at the bottom of Morningside Road where it joins with Morningside Terrace. Walk along Morningside Terrace (for about 5 mins) then take the signposted turn into the hospital.

From Waverly/Haymarket Railway Station

Those arriving at Haymarket or Waverly station should take a taxi to the Royal Edinburgh Hospital, Morningside. It is important to stress Morningside as the New Royal Infirmary has been recently opened in a completely different part of Edinburgh and taxi drivers have been making mistakes. Ask specifically for the Andrew Duncan Clinic and tell the driver to drop you off at the 'Yellow Doors' entrance (most drivers will know this entrance).

From Edinburgh Airport

Leave Edinburgh Airport at the only junction where the city centre is signposted. This involves leaving a roundabout at the first exit and joining the Glasgow Road towards the city centre. Once on the Glasgow Road, continue to follow the signs for South Gyle and the city centre until you see a sign for the city bypass (A720). Follow the signs for this road and join the city bypass southbound. Once on the bypass, continue round until you see an exit marked Lothianburn Junction. Leave the bypass at this point and turn first left at the roundabout towards the city centre. Continue for approximately 2 miles through a series of traffic lights until you pass through a junction with a Bank of Scotland on the left hand corner and a large free-standing clock on your right hand side. Continue ahead at this junction until you see a left turn signposted 'Royal Edinburgh Hospital' and 'Scottish Ambulance Service'.
